













So that is a total of 61 official M2 activities in 2016 – an average of over 5 a month. Not too bad if I do say so myself!





RIDER Education Ramblings

Who is the Boss? by tim bryan

This article inspired by writing from Joe & Judy Pirillo of Iowa.

Many of us ride with a passenger if only occasionally. Most of the time that passenger is either a spouse or a long time co-rider. However on occasion we get the opportunity to bring along the company of another passenger without experience in riding. Perhaps even if this person rides with someone often, but

not with us. Today, I am discussing two important elements when choosing to ride with a passenger. How to act while riding. And, what to discuss before and during the ride. Some of this I learned from flying but it is so relevant in this situation also.

How we act during this ride can literally make or break the desire of this person to ever ride again. If the passenger is new to riding, they may already be a bit reluctant to ride and even more so if they don't know you too well. I had the opportunity to take quite a few passengers in my airplane whom had never flown before or at least not in a small plane. The last thing I wanted to do was show off or scare them. Take offs were gradual acceleration, climbs were gradual as was any turns or maneuvers. This should hold true to riding a motorcycle mide a processing of the procesing of the processing of the processing o

with a passenger. Remember they have no control over your actions while seated on the back. Can you start out from a stop without lurching or weaving? Can you shift without whipping the riders head back? Can you stop without their head hitting the back of your helmet or the bike starting to lean sideways? These should be the goals for this ride. You can ride more aggressive when you are alone and the situation provides for your safe actions. I really doubt they will be impressed with any aggressive riding even if it seems so to the rider. There is one thing I particularly find important that is not related to a passenger is how we demonstrate our riding etiquette. I see quite a few motorcycle riders on the road dodging and weaving, taking off and passing others on the shoulders of the

> road and such. When I ride, I would prefer other cars around me not have any reason to think of me or my riding negatively. I prefer this for any passengers as well.

According to the article written by Joe and Judy, they suggest the passenger is the boss. If they are not comfortable for any reason and wish that you stop or slow down, they get to dictate. This is certainly a good way to look at it. So with this, let me suggest some ideas about what to discuss with them before they get on the bike.

The passenger does not need to worry about leaning. The bike will naturally (Continued on page 8)

lean in the corners and if they are just sitting in the seat, they will naturally lean with the bike but will still be sitting straight away from the bike. They may find it easier if they look in the direction of the turn. If the bike has an intercom system then they are free to participate in a discussion with me during the ride; encourage actually. If there is a CB communication, then they may need to yield to that conversation, but otherwise just speak as desired. These are simple examples of instructions to help them feel welcome and comfortable.





How to mount and dismount from the motorcycle. I like to have my feet both firmly planted on the ground with the motorcycle standing directly upright. I typically leave the side stand down in the event my left foot slips during the mount, but that has not happened as of yet. With a new passenger it is difficult to understand how to stand up on the foot board while keeping their weight up over the motorcycle. Be prepared for that, but you should attempt to brief them on this. Dismounting is the reverse but equally as important. You could and probably should ask them not to mount or dismount without some communication letting you know or your acknowledgement that you are ready.

I believe it is a good idea to discuss that while there is no expectation of an accident, what they should do if the bike is to fall over. Show them the side guards on the bike and explain how they are designed to keep the bike off the ground enough to protect the legs and feet. If your passenger attempts to put their feet out to stop the fall, they are more likely to get injured. Keeping them

on the floorboards is much more likely to reduce injury.

One final thing to discuss is how to enjoy the ride. Take in the scenery, the smells, and sensations of being out and away from daily activity. Encourage them to wave at other motorcycles passing by and to others watching from the side of the road. Hopefully, they will get the sense this will be a fun and enjoyable time and they should develop trust for you and your ability to ride in a safe and predictable manner.

So then, who is the boss? I would suggest you both are. If either of you need to stop you should stop. If either of you need to slow down or ride different, then so be it. Perhaps that differs from Joe & Judy Pirillo, but I think it really doesn't change the point. If your rider has a need, you have that need then also.

Have fun, ride safe, be a role model.




